

# Roots Reggae artist 'Little Roy' drops in to Generation Radio

Resident and Jamaican roots reggae artist, 'Little Roy', dropped in to the Generation Radio studio recently as a star guest on Murzi's Thursday evening show.

Murzi presents regular shows on Generation Radio at weekends and on Thursday evenings, playing hip hop and reggae music. He said: "Little Roy came to the studio with some of his favourite music he had recorded over the last 40 years. We started by playing his very first single 'Bongo Naya', which was released while he was still at school. It became his biggest hit, reaching number 1 in the singles charts in Jamaica.

"We listened to some wicked tunes like 'Tribal Wars' and 'Prophesy' – about eight songs in total. Midway through the interview he passed me an instrumental of 'Christopher Columbus', three minutes later he was singing live on top of the riddim (Jamaican Patois term for rhythm). He's got an amazing voice and it was the highlight of the interview, and throughout the interview it felt like I was chatting to a friend."

Generation Radio is growing in listeners and this has led to an increase in the number of local people getting involved in their local radio station.
